## WHAT STILL NEEDS TO HAPPEN

WWE must not let this "revolution" pass as a fad and eventually place women's wrestling on the backburner once again. WWE must continue to take the women, including the NXT women,

seriously. Perhaps Bayley, an interesting character and wrestler, could be pulled up to the main roster next.

Bring back the Women's Championship and shelf the Diva's Championship. Save the "Divas" name for the reality show and female managers. Female wrestlers can be divas or sex symbols, but their wrestling skills and charisma should be more important than their beauty. There also needs to be respect and tolerance for different body types, including larger women.

Give the women wrestlers a spotlight. They need adequate time on RAW and SmackDown. In particular, this would allow SmackDown to spend less time recapping RAW.

Riding the wave of change, WWE should bring back the Cruiserweight Title and allow the likes of Daniel Bryan and Neville who are not big guys to compete for it. That would shake up things even more.

Now that the women seem to be headed for a platform where they can be taken seriously, the possibilities in WWE could be endless.
